Randy C. Hauschildt, 68, a lifelong resident of Marengo, died peacefully Friday, Sept. 13, 2024, surrounded by his family.

Born June 17, 1956, in Belvidere, the son of David and Beverly (Guse) Hauschildt. Graduated from Marengo High School class of 1974. On August 27, 1988, he married his loving wife of 36 years, Deborah (Bethke).

At the age of 16, Randy was eager to get a job, so he began working for Harrison House Clothing Store in Marengo. Then, in 1983, he purchased the store and became a successful small business owner for 12 years. In 1995, Randy then transitioned into banking, where he had a successful career with Harris Bank and BMO for 26 years, proudly retiring in 2021. He always cherished his relationships with the many great employees and customers over the years. Randy was also instrumental in developing and opening Glo-Bowl Fun Center.

In 2021, Randy was diagnosed with liver cancer and on July 2, 2022, he was a gracious recipient of a liver transplant. He and his family were so blessed to receive this precious gift which gave Randy more time to make beautiful memories with his beloved family and friends. His journey throughout the liver transplant process with Loyola Medicine touched him so deeply, that his final wish was to donate his body as an anatomical gift to further advance medical research.

Randy avidly supported and was passionately involved in the Marengo Community for many years. He was a Chamber of Commerce board member, later serving as President for multiple terms. He also enjoyed the privilege of being MC for the Settler's Day parade, MASEF, and his grandkids' fundraising galas. Randy was a faithful member of St. John's Lutheran Church where he served as Elder, President of Congregation, President of Governing Board and was currently leading the congregation on the Building Expansion Project. In his spare time, he enjoyed golfing, road trips with Debbie and was a diehard Chicago Cubs fan. Randy was a kind and caring man, willing to help anyone in need. His friendly smile, wit and charming personality will be missed by his loving family and everyone that had the honor of knowing him.
